Forgotten Feline Program

The Forgotten Felines program helps care for and control the population of wild cats in Jackson County. This management program for feral cats involves caring adults willing to humanely trap the cats so they can be evaluated, vaccinated against rabies, and sterilized by the CHS staff veterinarian Wendy Serino D.V.M. The cat also has one of their ears tipped, making a sterilized cat easily detectable within the colony. After surgery, the cats are released back into their familiar habitat and colony under the lifelong care of their caretaker.

Here is one feral cat's story:

I have been on my own for as long as I can remember - digging through garbage cans to find my next meal. I'd get mad and fight with other cats also searching for food. I must say, cat bites really hurt and who knows what kind of diseases they carry!

Occasionally I'd come across a pretty little kitty that I liked to spend time with. We'd hunt birds and other small critters. But each time I met a gal it always seemed to end the same way. She'd eventually be worn out; toting five or six

kittens around and I'd need to move on.

A while back, I came across a group of outdoor cats living in a brush pile. They weren't hungry, though, because they had dishes of food and water appear everyday. I was so happy when they let me join them.

One day I was startled by human voices. The humans brought large silver boxes with them and placed them all around our feeding area. I decided to investigate, especially because the food inside was the best I'd ever smelled! After I walked into the box to taste the food the door closed behind me. Soon I was in the back of a car, entering a building where there were more humans than I had ever seen. I started yelling and hissing. They knew I'd bite if they tried to touch me! I was planning my escape when something snuck up and "bit" me on the behind. It only hurt for a second and then I felt really sleepy. What could it hurt to take a quick cat nap before I made a break for it?

When I awakened I was a little disoriented - my ear and my behind were a little sore too. Whatever "bit" me got me good, I would probably be walking funny for a day or so! But I was home! I immediately recognized my surroundings and longed to get out of this box and make a run for it. Suddenly the door opened just a crack and I hit the ground running. I made a mad dash for the brush pile and that's where I am today.

The humans still come to bring fresh food and water and occasionally they trap the new members of our group in those silver boxes. I can tell when they return that they were "bitten" on the behind the same way I was. The humans may be smart but I have their game all figured out. They will *never* catch me in one of those boxes again!

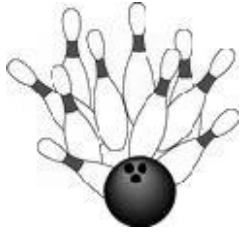

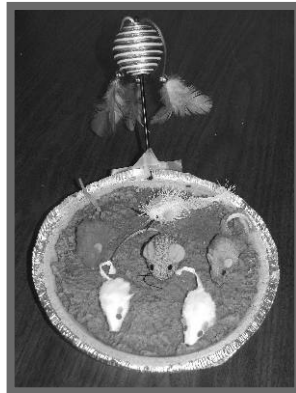
Cats & Dogs Celebrate National Pie Day

Ask the Expert

Spring is the time of year when your pets start to enjoy spending more and more time outdoors. As much as they love the outdoors, there are dangers lurking around every corner.

Mosquitoes pose a threat not only because of their irritating and itchy bites, but also because they are carriers of heartworm larvae. Mosquitoes pick up the larvae when biting an infected animal and can transfer the larvae to an uninfected animal, causing heartworms to gather and grow in your pet's heart. Heartworm positive pets are treatable in most cases but the treatment can be painful and not without complications.

Flea infestation is another pesky problem that most pet owners have had to deal with at one time or another. Even a mild case of flea infestation can be uncomfortable for your pet, and may result in another parasite altogether. Tapeworms are caused by your pet ingesting fleas and can be passed quickly between pets in your household

Moderate to severe infestations can cause flea allergy dermatitis (FAD) and possibly anemia. FAD is a very painful skin condition for your pet and can be difficult to treat.

Anemia, especially in severe cases, can potentially cause death. The risk of death is greater with puppies and kittens.

As the ground thaws, many dangerous forms of intestinal parasites come to life. These life threatening parasites can cause weight loss, diarrhea, and possibly death if left untreated.

It is recommended that every spring you make an appointment with your veterinarian so they can create an individualized health care plan for your furry family member. In most cases, the best treatment is prevention.

Peanut Ponders...What's in a Name?

I love the way people say my name. They smile and rub my tummy and say, "Peeeeeeenut" or "Nut Nut!" At CHS we name every animal that didn't arrive with a name. Snuggles, Sunshine and Rosie were named because of their personalities. The kittens, Rhett and Scarlett, were named after movie characters. Capone and Gotti arrived named after famous gangsters. Other names remind us of where we found them like Ella, the tiny kitten rescued after being thrown from a moving car in Ella Sharp Park and Loomis the deaf and blind pup found in Loomis Park. Holly turned up at Christmas and Elvis, the hound dog... well the reason for his name is obvious, right?

The best names tell a story. Schatzi, the little dachshund, was named by his adoptive family because it means "jewel or treasure." Pudgelove, the puppy, was named by his foster mother. Guess who ended up adopting him? And Grace is the lone survivor of an abandoned litter.

Every animal here at CHS comes in with a story we may never know, but we make sure they leave here with a special name ... and a second chance for happiness.

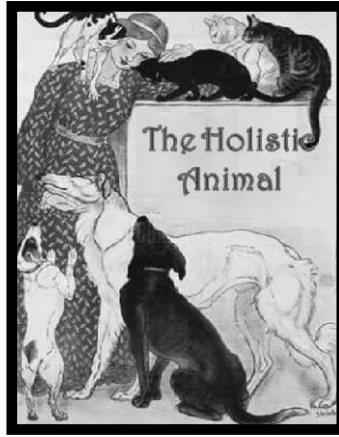
